In accordance with federal reporting requirements listed numerically below, Wayland provides the corresponding information describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF),

Wayland disbursed funds equitably across all students who 1) apply for HEERF funds and 2) meet federal eligibility requirements. Based on the total amount of funds available for disbursement (\$1,254,863) and the maximum number of students who would be potentially eligible to receive funds should they apply (2,427), the initial grant amount for each Wayland student was \$520. The number of eligible applicants awarded resulted in funds remaining available. As a result, a second disbursement of \$1,200 was initiated in December 2020 to the students initially awarded. Students who apply for HEERF funds after this second disbursement and meet eligibility requirements will receive the total of the two disbursements (\$1,720) based on the remaining availability of HEERF funds.

CRRSSA

Eligible students were enrolled during the spring 2021 term at any of Wayland campus, have a valid FAFSA on file with WBU for the 2020-21 academic year, and have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of 0 to 5,700 (Pell Grant eligible range). Students with a 0 EFC will receive \$1,000 and students with an EFC between 1 and 5,700 will receive \$650. International and DACA students are excluded from eligibility for this federal program.

Unlike HEERF I, students receiving HEERF II will not need an application and they will have the option to allow WBU to apply funds towards an outstanding student account balance prior to releasing credit. HEERF II eligible students gave permission to apply funding to balances owed to WBU by completing the <u>HEERF</u> <u>II Payment Consent Form</u> or checking the applicable box on the Summer Attendance Worksheet.

In addition, \$250 of HEERF II will be awarded to any student with a Pell eligible EFC who is enrolled in the summer 2021 term.

Eligible students were enrolled during the fall 2021 term at any Wayland campus, have a valid FAFSA on file with WBU for the 2021-22 academic year, and have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of 0 to 35,000 (cost of attendance).
