College Vaccine Requirements

Effective October 1, 2013, a recent change to Texas State law (SB 62) mandates that all entering students under the age of 22 provide a certificate signed by a health care provider or an official immunization record verifying that a student has been vaccinated against bacterial meningitis, or has received a booster during the five years prece ding admission to the University . The vaccine must be received prior to the 10th day before the first day of the semester
